☐ Avoid touching common public surfaces that other people touch – like door panels, doorknobs, etc.	☐ Eat a Healthy & Balanced Diet (low in sugar). A balanced diet rich in antioxidants (found in vegetables and fruits) and healthy fats can help support your immune system.
☐ Clean and frequently disinfect surfaces and objects (like your cell phone!) that are frequently touched. You can use a regular household cleaner or wipe for this.	☐ Stay Hydrated. Drinking water helps your cells operate optimally, plus it helps your body more easily process food & eliminate waste. ☐ Exercise. Moderate to intense workouts
